



Demolition Residential & Commercial Permit Check List

Florida Building Code 8th Edition (2023)

Office of Building Services

Demolition permits expire 60 days from the date of issuance.

- ☐ [Building Permit Application](#)
 - Required to be signed by the license holder or an authorized agent
 - Building department staff must notarize the owner's signature for permit issuance for owner-builders
- ☐ [Owner Builder Disclosure Statement](#)
 - Required if the property owner will be applying for an owner-builder permit
- ☐ [Demolition Affidavit](#)
 - Each person named on the warranty deed or an authorized member via articles of incorporation must fill out an owner's affidavit
- ☐ [Notice of Commencement](#)
 - A notice of commencement must be recorded and certified for permits with a job value over \$5,000. The property owner or an assigned member through articles of incorporation which can be found through sunbiz.org must sign the NOC
- ☐ Site Plan
 - Site plan that clearly shows which structure(s) are scheduled to be demoed
- ☐ Required Inspections
 - Preliminary: To proceed with demolition, the preliminary inspection must pass
 - Final Building: Demolition completed, and site cleared



A Warning to Owner-Builder Permit Applicants

If you do not intend to do the work yourself and have been asked by someone without a contractor's license to pull the building permit, you are at risk of financial harm and penalty. Section 489.103(7) Florida Statutes states that owners of property must directly supervise the work being performed. Any person working on your construction project who is not a licensed contractor must be employed by you. Therefore, you must deduct FICA and withholding tax and provide workers' compensation for the employee. Without worker's compensation insurance, you could be held liable for injuries received on your property. Typically, your homeowner's insurance policy will not honor your claim if the work performed requires a licensed contractor. You could be responsible for thousands of dollars of medical bills.

NOT ONLY IS IT DANGEROUS, IT IS ALSO A CRIME

Section 455.227, Florida Statutes states that any person who knowingly aids, assists, procures, employs, or advises an unlicensed individual can be charged with a first-degree misdemeanor and may face fines up to \$5,000.00 for each offense. It is important to know that owners of property do not receive a discounted permit fee for obtaining a permit themselves. A licensed contractor in good standing with the Building Department will always obtain a permit for your project.

2023 Florida Statutes Section 489.103(7)(c) and 489.503 OWNER/ BUILDER DISCLOSURE STATEMENT**

The Owner builder must be present at the time of application. To qualify under this subsection, the Owner Builder must personally appear to sign the building permit application, the owner builder disclosure statement, and associated documents to satisfy local permitting agency requirements, if any, proving that the owner has a complete understanding of the owner's obligations under the law as specified in this disclosure statement.
